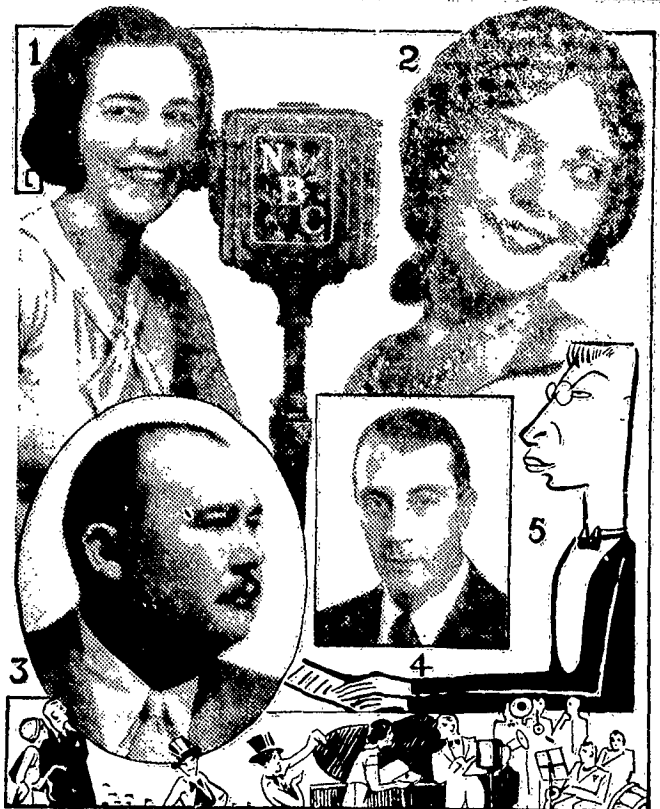
**Shea's Century**

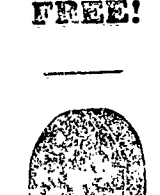
