AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF TAXES UNDER ARTICLE 7 OF "THE GENERAL CITY LAW" The Common Council of the City of Lackawanna does ordain as follows: Section 1. The City of Lackawanna elects to issue notes in anticipation of taxes under Article 7 of the General City Law as amended in the amount of \$125,000.00. Said notes shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of taxes of the City of Lackawanna for the years 1931 and prior thereto which have been heretofore levied and are now unpaid and delinquent in an amount in excess of One Hundred and Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00).

Section 2. The purposes for which said notes are to be issued are for expenses for maintenance, salaries, repairs, current operation and administration of the property and government of the City payable from such taxes. Section 3. The maximum rate of interest which such notes are to bear is six per centum per annum. Section 4. All conditions precedent to the issuance of such notes have been fully complied with. Section 5. The faith and credit of the City of Lackawanna shall be pledged for the payment of the principal and interest of said notes, which shall contain a recital to that effect. Section 6. The unpaid and delinquent taxes of the City for the years 1931 and prior thereto are hereby pledged to the

payment of the principal and interest of said notes and in the event that a sufficient amount of such taxes is not collected and on hand for such purpose at the time of making the next annual city budget there shall be included in the next annual budget for the fiscal year January 1, 1933 to December 31, 1933 a sum sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said notes, after deducting the amount so collected and paid to apply thereon.

Section 7. Said notes shall be executed and issued by the Mayor and Treasurer of the City and sealed with the corporate seal ordered by the City Clerk. Section 8. Said notes shall contain a recital that they are issued pursuant to Article 7 of the General City Law, and such recital shall be conclusive evidence of the regularity of the issue of said notes and of their validity, and shall further recite that in the issuance of such notes, all requirements of law have been fully complied with, and no debt or other limit prescribed by the Constitution or laws of the State of New York has been exceeded.

Section 9. Said notes shall be sold for not less than par in the manner required by statute for the sale of bonds. Section 10. A copy of this ordinance and of a certificate signed by the City Clerk stating the facts and date of its adoption shall be published once prior to the issuance of such notes in two newspapers published and circulating in the City of Lackawanna. Section 11. That the validity of said notes may be contested (except on the ground that they are issued in violation of the Constitution) only in an action or proceeding commenced within twenty days after the publication of this ordinance or as provided in Section One Hundred and Twelve of Article 7 of the General City Law as amended.

Section 12. Such notes shall be issued in denominations of \$5,000.00 each, numbered serially from 1 to 25, both inclusive, dated August 1, 1932, or such later date as the City Treasurer shall determine and maturing December 31, 1932. Section 13. This ordinance shall take effect immediately. The question of the adoption of the foregoing ordinance was duly put to a vote, which resulted as follows: AYES: Edward Donowick, Councilman First Ward; John Aszklar, Councilman Second Ward; Ladislaus Paryz, Councilman Third Ward; Thomas Warren, Councilman Fourth Ward. 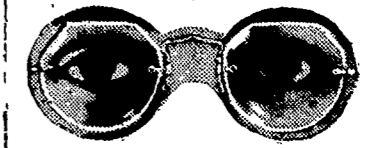

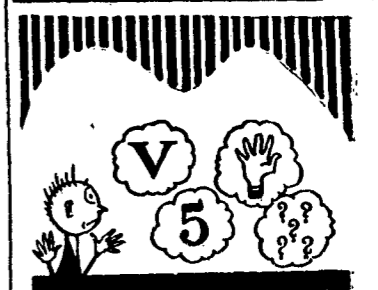

SOCIALIST LEADER TO SPEAK HERE

Aaron M. Orange candidate of the Socialist Labor Party for governor of New York state, will be in Lackawanna the latter part of this week. It was announced Wednesday by officials of the Lackawanna section of the party. Mr. Orange will give addresses Friday and Saturday evenings July 15 and 16, on the corner of Ridge road and Steelawanna avenue at 8 o'clock and at 9 o'clock Sunday afternoon in the Friendship House auditorium. The Socialist candidate was born in New York city in 1905. He attended the city schools and graduated from the college of the City of New York in 1926. He entered the school system that same year as a teacher and at the same time continued his studies at Teachers College of Columbia university. He received the degree of Master of Arts in 1928. In 1930 he discontinued his studies at the university and entered the Socialist Labor party, becoming a member of that organization in November of that year. Since that time he has been active in the affairs of the party and is also the author of a pamphlet entitled, "Economic Basis of Education, which deals with the principals of the party.
