### PARISH CLOSURE ANNUAL FESTIVAL

The Tenth Annual August Festival and Carnival of the Queen of Peace Parish terminated last Sunday Night, August 14th, concluding nine successive nights of entertainment, entertaining thousands who passed through the front gate of the Church Grounds, Genesee and Forman Streets. This year the affair enjoyed ideal weather. Despite the difficult times, the committee was happily rewarded for their long strenuous efforts. Over on hundred trained parish workers combine each year to work on the various stands and attractions. Seven amusement park riding devices were used this year to augment the other features. Boxing, Stage Show and other entertainment alternated each night.

The outstanding evenings drew large crowds to witness the alphabetical automobile contest awards. The winning letters being T F O V Q H and I I C. The affair as a whole was popularly received again this year. A Dutch lunch and dance was given by the workers for their own after-noon, in the big school auditorium, Tuesday Night after the close of the carnival.

### FISHING LICENSES WILL BE ISSUED TO JOBLESS

Many unemployed men in the State of New York have turned, without benefit of license, to fishing in the wellstocked waters of the state. For some it meant replenishing of food supplies for their families. To others, born fishermen, it was a brief respite from the dreary hours of unemployment.

Some of the jobless anglers like the fish were caught. But none was fined. They were forced however to give up their fishing. But now brighter days are in store for many of these jobless fishermen.

Under a plan of Harry L. Hopkins, Chairman of the State Temporary Emergency Relief Administration, it will now be possible for Public Welfare Commissioner of the various communities to pay for licenses for unemployed men investigated and certified for relief.

The local county, city and town welfare officers have been informed by Mr. Hopkins of the plan whereby the issuance of the free license will become a part of the Home Relief system of the Temporary Emergency Relief Administration. The Administration will pay 40 per cent of the cost license fees. The local Welfare Departments are to pay the balance of the fee.

Issuance of free licenses does not mean that the waters of the State will be overrun by jobless anglers, that they will or that the unemployed fishermen will soon be depleted by their stocks of fish interfere with the regular anglers who fish just for the sport of it.

Nor will the unemployed fishermen attempt to compete with local fish dealers by underselling them at either wholesale or prevailing retail rates, for this home relief project will be governed by rules of the Temporary Emergency Relief Administration just as all other relief
