siding" was a paint, or as a salesman for the firm put it, a "coating pigmented with aluminum." These — and several other discrepancies in the offer, including a "free" roof which wasn't free — caused the Bureau to request the advertiser to discontinue the offer. He did.

An automobile dealer just happened to have 61 cars for sale at the same time the 1961 models were coming off the assembly lines. He ran an ad featuring "61" cars. The BBB investigator assigned to shop the offer was amazed when told by a salesman that the offer was for a quantity of 61 used 1960 cars. The ad was dropped by the dealer after being contacted by the BBB.
These are only a few of the lines covered, indicating that it is always wise to be cautious before falling for misleading advertising.
