Artist is featured in exhibit

ALBANY - Work by a local artist is on display through September 1 at the Albany Institute of History & Art in the 1996 exhibition by artists of the Mohawk-Hudson region. Celebrating its 60th anniversary, this annual juried exhibition pays tribute to the many talented artists working within one hundred miles of Albany. The "Regional" features 82 works by 65 artists representing 40 communities. Included is a sculpture by artist Christine Heller, titled "Down." One of the longest-running regionals in the country, the exhibition occupies a major role in history of 20th century art activity in the Albany area. The Albany Institute, the Schenectady Museum and Planetarium, and the University Art Museum of the University at Albany share the responsibility for organizing the exhibition as it rotates from site to site. The juror this year was Jock Reynolds, a nationally-recognized visual artist and director of the Addison Gallery of American Art at Phillips Academy in Andover, MA. Major support for this exhibition was provided by Omni Development Company Inc. and Nacan Management Corp. Additional support was provided by the AT&T Foundation. Cash awards for artists were donated by The Picotte Companies; First Albany Corporation, Daniel V. McNamee Jr. Memorial Fund; The Swyer Companies; Austin and Co. Inc.; The Board of Trustees of Albany Center Galleries in honor of Leslie Urbach; Clement Frame & Art Shops; and Frame's Plus Tie.
