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Mrs. Wadsworth Heartily Endorses Present Organization of Athletics

Outlines Merits of All-Around
Training—Pleased With
Lamron.

"I see no reason why horseback riding should not be a practical sport for the Normal girls," said Mrs. W. Austin Wadsworth, founder of the Elizabeth Wadsworth Nursing Home, in the course of a recent interview with *The Lamron*. "Horseback riding, swimming and fencing are the three sports from which I have had the most pleasure.

"The plan of athletics for all students is something I have been hoping for for years," continued Mrs. Wadsworth. "I am heartily in favor of the present organization and believe that we all ought to stand behind Miss Seger in the work she is doing.

"I saw no way of organizing the work myself, but used the Nursing Home not only as a place of cure, but also as a means for prevention, and to give me opportunities to instill my views on the subjects of health and athletics for the girls of Geneseo Normal School. Every year I have seen girls graduated who were suffering from nervous fatigue and mental indigestion."

"Education of brain leads to only 50% efficiency," continued Mrs. Wadsworth, "for only in rare cases is one able to have a keen, properly balanced mind without a strong body. We can not all be Stevensons or Florence Nightingales. Such unbalanced development cannot lead to an efficient life for yourself, your home, your community or your country."

In regard to girls' athletics in general, Mrs. Wadsworth stated that she could not emphasize too strongly all-around training which leads to greater resourcefulness and efficiency and teaches the elements of good sportsmanship.

Summing up her message to all who take part in any endeavor, Mrs. Wadsworth added, "Aim al-

is Cleared Up by Administrative

So-Called 'Cuts' Not Allowed

Do you go horseback riding, bicycle riding or hiking without permission?

Do you take a chaperon with you when you go to the lake or some similar place?

Do you know that three cuts from chapel or any class takes you before the administrative committee?

If you do or do not it will pay you to read the following.

To go horseback riding it is necessary to have permission. Miss Seger is the only one who is able to give it.

Provided the landlady is told where you are going, it is not necessary to ask permission to go to Fall Brook or a mile out of town. If hiking parties wish to go farther than this, the faculty advisers should be notified.

Regulations regarding bicycle riding are the same as those for horseback riding.

If picnic parties of at least six wish to go to the Deserted House, the Haunted House or to Fall Brook, only the landladies need be told.

A group going to the lake or some similar place should ask a chaperon to go with them.

Absolutely no absences granted from chapel or any class. Three cuts from either take you before the administrative committee for explanation.

The students are asked to conform to these rules not because the faculty wish to know every thing they do, but so that in case messages come for them the authorities will be able to tell where they are.

As for allowance of absence, the course is too short to allow anyone to be absent from any class without a good reason.
