

require nearly two years to bring them to perfect maturity, for they are not generally thought sufficiently mellow for use until considerably decayed; and in order to forward their ripeness, it is said, that, besides being placed in damp, but warm cellars, they are sometimes wrapped in strong brown paper, and sunk in a hot-bed."

**PRESERVATION OF CUCUMBERS.**—In Germany and Poland, it is said barrels of cucumbers, of various sizes, and ages, headed up water tight, are preserved fresh, from one year to another, by immersing them in deep wells, where the uniform temperature and exclusion of the air seem to be the preserving agents.
